David Lloyd-Seed is an experienced Investor Relations and capital markets practitioner. He is currently Director of Investor Relations at Telefonica UK (O2). Prior to that David was IR and Corporate Affairs Director at Dixons Retail for almost 10 years which included the merger with Carphone Warehouse. Most recently he was Interim Head of IR at Severn Trent and a partner at Tulchan Communications, a strategic communications adviser. Prior to joining Dixons Retail in 2005, David worked as a corporate broker for 18 years latterly as a Director with Citi. During his time in corporate broking he advised a number of companies on IR, market related activities, fund raisings, mergers and IPOs across a number of sectors.

About the Keynote Speaker

Douglas Flint - Former Group Chairman, HSBC



Douglas Flint retired as Group Chairman of HSBC Holdings plc on 30th September 2017, having been appointed to that role in December 2010. For fifteen years prior to this he was HSBC's Group Finance Director, joining from KPMG where he was a partner. Between 2005 and 2011 he was also a Non-Executive Director of BP plc. Mr Flint was chairman of the Institute of International Finance from June 2012 to December 2016 and was a member of both the Mayor of Beijing's and the Mayor of Shanghai's International Business Leaders' Advisory Councils. Amongst other roles he is currently Chairman of the Archbishop of Canterbury's Just Finance Foundation, a Director of the Centre for Policy Studies, Chairman of the Corporate Board of Cancer Research UK and a Trustee of the Royal Marsden Cancer Charity. In December 2017 he was appointed by the Chancellor as Special Envoy to China's Belt and Road Initiative.

In June 2006 Mr Flint was honoured with a CBE by the Queen, in recognition of his services to the finance industry. Douglas Flint was educated at The High School of Glasgow, Glasgow University and Harvard Business School.

Evan Davis



Evan Davis is a presenter of the BBC2 current affairs programme Newsnight, a role he began in September 2014. From April 2008 up to then he was a presenter of the Today programme on BBC Radio 4. He is also well-known as the presenter of The Bottom Line, a weekly business discussion programme on Radio 4. Prior to the Today programme he was the Economics Editor of the BBC, the most senior economics reporter in the corporation. He was promoted to that role after working as an economics correspondent for the BBC and as economics editor of the Newsnight programme on BBC2 in the 1990s. Before joining the BBC in 1993, he was an economist at the Institute for Fiscal Studies, and at the London Business School. He has written numerous papers, articles and newspaper and magazine columns as well as the book, Public Spending, (published by Penguin in 1998). He is also a co-author of the Penguin Dictionary of Economics and the New Penguin Dictionary of Business. He studied at St John's College Oxford (1981 to 1984) and at the Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University (1986 to 1988).

Steve Boxer - Managing Director, FCLTGlobal



Steve Boxer joined FCLTGlobal in 2017 after nearly eleven years of working for Wellington Management in Fixed Income Product Management in Boston and London. While at Wellington, Steve focused on credit investing, including High Yield Bonds, Structured Finance and Leveraged Loans. Prior to Wellington, Steve worked at Babson Capital (now Barings) and in sales roles at Fannie Mae and an internet startup, Visible Markets. She has published research notes on a number of sector issues including the Living Wage and risk of sugar becoming the next tobacco. Here she conducted ESG analysis on companies in which Newton had significant holdings, company engagements across all regions and sectors and completed proxy voting for all of Newton's UK and European listed holdings. Prior to this she worked at F&C Investments (now part of BMO Global Asset Management). She attended Nottingham Trent University (2003 – 2007) attaining First Class Honours in Business with Accounting and Finance. She holds the IMC and CFA Level 1.

Ed Peel is Vice Chairman of Corporate Broking Europe. He joined Bank of America Merrill Lynch in September 2011. For the previous 5 years was Co-Head of Corporate Broking. Prior to joining Bank of America Merrill Lynch Ed was Head of UK ECM for Nomura and prior to this Head of Equity Sales for Nomura in USA for European product. Ed worked for Lehman Brothers from 2000 to 2008 as Head of Sales for Europe and European Product Globally, he was on both Equities and sales global executive committees. He retains extensive and regular contacts with buy side institutions globally, notably in USA and UK. Ed started his career at HSBC James Capel before moving to Donaldson Lufkin and Jenrette. At Bank of America Merrill Lynch Ed is lead corporate broker on a number of FTSE100 and FTSE 250 companies.
